I am hoping to be discharged home in September 2020 and have started to have visits outside of the hospital. I have two carers in place but need to build up my team to help my transition home and to ensure I have a team of carers in place when I do get home. We are looking for male/ female carers who have experience of working with young men who need personal care and have physical and communication needs.

We need people who are willing to be flexible with working hours as we navigate the transition process; and become more of aware of what my support package looks like from being in hospital to a home environment.

We want to welcome carers who will become part of our family.
